L.A. County Skilled **Trades Summers Impact Snapshot**

The nonpartisan FDR Group conducted an independent evaluation of the program, which has served over 1,500 students from public schools and CBOs over the past four years. These are the key findings:



Parents believe their child will be more likely to graduate from high school as a result of taking part in a skilled trades summer program.

Almost half of the high school graduates surveyed have pursued further education in a skilled trade, and almost 1 in 4 have worked for pay in a skilled trade.



Harbor Freight Tools for Schools surveyed students, parents, and staff affiliated with nine skilled trades summer programs. The findings are based on both qualitative and quantitative research conducted between May and December 2024, including: 9 focus groups with high school students who had participated in a skilled trades summer program and parents of high school students who participated; 20 leadership interviews; and online surveys with 286 students, 117 parents, and 64 staff (that is, adults affiliated with the summer programs). The research was conducted by the nonpartisan FDR Group.
